Presented by the Human Trafficking Unit at the Denver District Attorney's Office, this training will give an overview of human trafficking in Denver, discuss investigative and prosecutorial challenges, review the impact of trauma-informed victim services, and highlight multidisciplinary response efforts in our local community. The training will include a case analysis, a discussion on relevant statistics, and provide attendees with applicable tools to better respond to human trafficking.

Join representatives from Arapahoe, Boulder, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson, and Mesa counties as we explore how electronic monitoring is being used in pretrial programs across the state. Each county will provide an overview of their usage of electronic monitoring, then we will open it up for questions and discussion on what technology means in pretrial supervision.

This session will describe the process of designing the program, the lessons learned from running the program, and outcome data. The learning objectives of this session include helping the audience understand the following: data analyses used to understand the need for the program, making the case for funding the program, negotiations between the DA and public defender during the design phase, post-implementation recalibration, learned lessons for dealing with the behavioral health pretrial population (as opposed to post-adjudication), and implications for the future of pretrial justice. This session will also cover themes including addressing clients' individualized responsivity factors and including clients' families in recovery and rehabilitation.
